In Spain and the rest of Europe, church growth is a slow, deliberate process. There are no instant signs of results so eagerly sought after in our "success-driven" U.S. market. What we do have is an unwavering trust in the Lord of the Harvest who promised "I will build my church" (Mat.16:18) and the Word of God which does not "return unto Him void" (Isa.55:11).



Cyndie's ministry reaches far beyond, corresponding with GU students, among others those who are prisoners, praying and counseling and many other ministry opportunities within and outside of the building's walls in person and on-line.

Global University in Cuba: There are presently over 3,000 ministers in Cuba studying with Global's B.A. degree program as well as those pursuing their Master's degree. This is in addition to those studying with the Facultad and ISUM programs which have been effectively serving in Cuba for a number of years with which Don also taught.

As Spanish Testing Coordinator she fulfills a very important role in guaranteeing the accuracy of the testing materials in the Spanish language for the undergraduate program in order to insure maximum quality in the education of our Spanish-speaking ministerial students around the world.


